BASIC FUNCTION:

The Manager, Network and Computer Services supports the Director of Network Services in maintaining an effective and efficient computing environment at Riverside Unified School District. The Manager of Network/Computer Services is responsible for managing and providing technical support and resources for end users of the organization's telecommunications, network, cabling infrastructure; has responsibility for functions related to the effective installation, operation, and maintenance, security and coordination of network, infrastructure related devices and servers; ensures that all network resources are available and backups are successful.

REPRESENTATIVE DUTIES:

Provide backup for the Director, Network Services, acting on his/her behalf as required.
Effectively supervise, motivate, develop and evaluate the performance of direct reports.
Provide technical support for the District which includes monitoring and determining security and resource parameter of all network systems.
Develop, maintain, and publish network hardware, network software and cabling infrastructure architectures.
Ensure that Network and Server monitoring procedures and tools are followed and current.
Identify and evaluate new technologies and their potential use within the District.
Review disaster recovery plans and backup procedures as they relate to data/network security.
Assist in the resolution of network and software problems impacting production systems and networks, as required.
Reviews all system design and implementation plans.
Manage special projects for the Director or other Senior Managers as requested.
Present proposals for new systems or the enhancement, improvement and/or replacement of existing systems.
Inform senior management of potential problems before they occur and communicate possible solutions.
Provide individual or group training for personnel on the capabilities of the organization's network and infrastructure systems.
Assist in the hiring and review of NIS staff as requested.
Perform all responsibilities within the guidelines of district policies, regulations, and procedures.
