MARCH—EMERGENCY EYEWASH AND SHOWERS

Chemical exposures can cause serious bodily injuries. Statistics show about 20% of eye injuries are the result of chemical exposures. In almost all cases, the recommended first-aid measure is to immediately flood the affected area of the body with copious quantities of water for 15 to 30 minutes. Having the right type of unit in the appropriate location is the key to reducing the potential for serious bodily damage if an incident should occur. Please take a moment to make sure that you know where all of our Emergency Eye Wash and Shower Stations are located and that you are aware of how to use them.
